Test and Evaluation



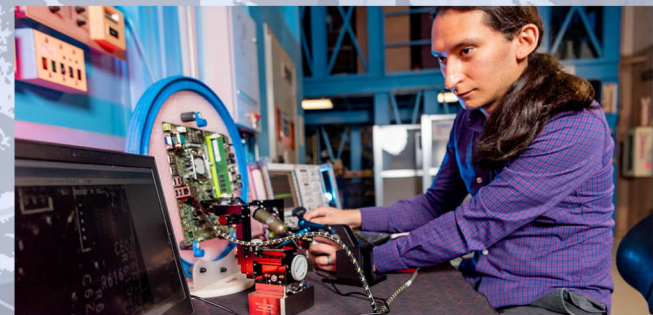

Combat Search and Rescue and Special Operations takes place at the 58th Special Operations Wing in five different rotary-, fixed-, and tilt-rotor aircraft types. The 58th also conducts undergraduate pilot training and survival, escape, resistance and evasion training at geographically separated locations.

Research & Development

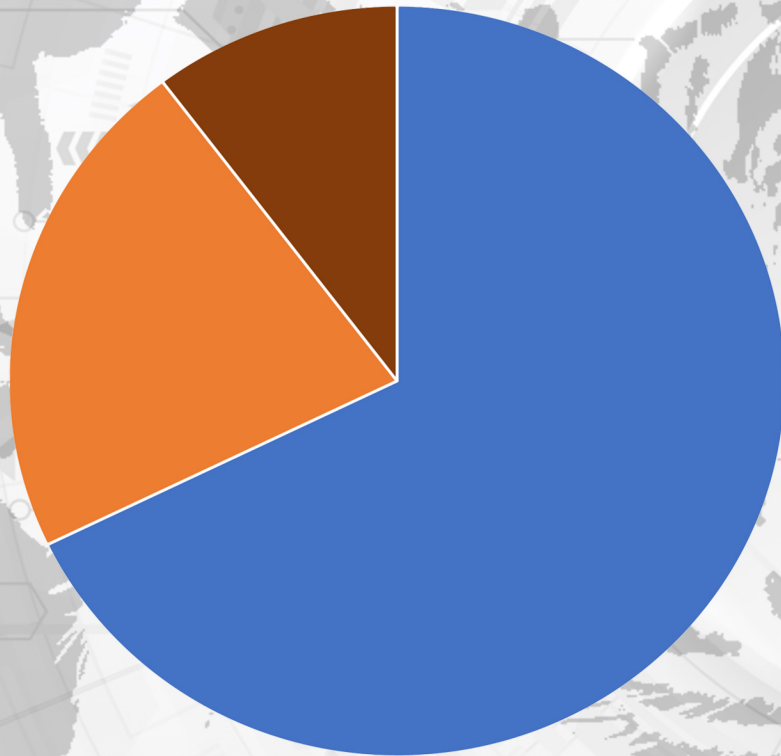
